Bent Tree

Giant Erratic

Spot a huge standalone boulder resting in a spot that looks unusual.

- **Look with your eyes, not your hands:** Leave flowers, rocks, and wildlife homes right where you found them.
- Work together with your trail group to spot items as a team!
